Daymap Connect Parent Portal

The Daymap Learning Management System is a school based application utilised by Clare High School. It provides information on a student-by-student basis which includes homework due dates, confirmation of submission of work and assessment results.

Our staff and students currently use Daymap as our core school operations system to record attendance information, lodge assessments, share classroom based resources etc.

The Parent Portal of Daymap (Daymap Connect) enables all parents to also access the Daymap system.

By using Daymap Connect, parents gain their own identities in Daymap to assist them in staying informed about school matters and individual student progress. It is accessible from any computer that has internet access.

This easy-to-use system allows parents to create and manage their own accounts for Daymap Connect, requiring only one login and password per parent to access details for all students enrolled at Clare High School.

From your Parent Portal page, you'll be able to view attendance details, assessment details, results, see homework requirements and access school messages and notices.

Here are the details to access your Daymap Connect Parent Portal:

Navigate to http://daymap.clarehs.sa.edu.au/daymapconnect and proceed to the <u>New User</u> button.

- 1. Enter the email address that you have on file with Clare High School.
- 2. Enter the ID number of your child. This can be found on their ID cards or in the 'My Details' section on your child's own Daymap account.
- 3. A password reset email will be sent to your email address with all the details required to log on to the portal.

Please Note – Parents who share a common email address will need to contact ICT at the school for a password reset.
